## **Presentation Sessions**

The scientific program will include keynote and plenary lectures and oral presentations as well as poster sessions. The program will be categorized to the following four topics:

1. Fundamentals of Biocatalysts I (Gene and Protein Engineering, Directed Evolution)
2. Fundamentals of Biocatalysts II (Characterization of Biocatalysts, Bio-informatics)
3. Application of Biocatalysts I (Bioconversion, Chemical Synthesis)
4. Application of Biocatalysts II (Biosensor, Bioremediation)

## **Call for Papers**

Papers within the scope of the conference are invited. If you wish to be

considered for an oral or poster presentation, please submit a one-page English abstract. The introduction, methods, results, discussion and main references should be briefly and clearly stated in the abstract. The abstract should be typed in single-space and printed out by laser printer within a 16 × 24 cm area on an A4 size white bond paper with top, left and right margins of 2.5 cm and with a bottom margin of 3.0 cm. Please type your abstract body in 10.5 point size, abstract title in 16 point size, author(s) list in 14 point size, author's address, fax, phone and E-mail address in 12 point slanting size. For details, refer to the example. Authors intending to submit papers to the conference are requested to send 2 copies of each paper.

The deadline for submission of abstract is July 31, 2006.

Chinese, Korean and Japanese participants should submit their abstracts to Professors Cheng JIN, Hak-Sung KIM and Shuji ADACHI, respectively, by e-mail.

All the abstracts will be reviewed by conference co-chairs and you will be notified whether your abstract has been accepted for an oral or poster presentation. If your abstract is accepted, you will receive an acceptance letter (an invitation letter) and a certificate for visa application from conference chairs.

The official language of the conference will be English.

### Conference Fees

The conference fee includes registration, banquet, conference publication and one-day tour. All the participants should pay themselves fees for hotel accommodation and meals (see the below list).
